

Renters are now protected by new CDC moratorium on evictions.

The Center for Disease Control has issued a moratorium on evictions through December 31, 2020. Renters unable to pay rent due to the toll COVID-19 has taken on their lives, can sign and provide to their landlord a declaration demonstrating the need for protection from eviction.


According to a legal opinion from Immigrant Legal Center, there are no immigration-relevant eligibility factors which would prevent any immigrant from asserting this eviction protection.

Tenants are responsible for the eventual payment of all rent and fees due, and are expected to make timely partial payments as possible.
