It's Official

When I was writing last month's newsletter, it was not official about where my appointment starting July 1st would be. But now it's official, I will be appointed to First United Methodist Omaha (aka, staying right here!) as the associate pastor. I will also be entering into the Transition into Ministry (TiM) program. This program is specific for those under 35 years old, who have their Master of Divinity, and are certified candidates. This program also comes with requirements for mentorship from both the pastor and lay members. The additional mentorship and requirements of the program will work in conjunction with my ordination process. Starting July 1st I will be a licensed local pastor, however I will be going before the Board of Ordained Ministry in 2023 to be commissioned as provisional elder. There is a lot of United Methodist jargon

around all this, but in short, I will be staying at First UMC for another two years. After the two years I will be appointed as a solo pastor at another church in the Great Plains Conference. This is a unique opportunity for churches because it allows young clergy to work in various settings and get experience before going out on their own in a church. I am excited to stay at First and also to develop my ministerial skills over the next few years. I'm also grateful for all of you who have supported me along the way for the last few years. It is exciting for me to move forward within my own call to serve the United Methodist church in different ways. If you have any questions about all this, I'll be happy to answer them. Know this: for the next two years, I'm going to develop my gifts and graces and serve here at First Church in ways that bring new life and hope for all people. Hope you'll join me along in this journey.

A WORD ABOUT MASKS

In rapidly changing circumstances, a federal judge recently struck down the mask mandate as we have understood it for the last two years. You may be excited about that, others who live with pre-existing conditions may have reservations.

The church has tried to be consistent with the recommendations from the CDC and that has not always been easy. Currently our standards for worship are that masks are recommended for vulnerable persons, for those not vaccinated, and for those with exposures or who are waiting on test results. Our building continues to have areas that are mask mandated – specifically the areas near the Rainbow Factory preschool which maintains its policy as set forth at the beginning of the year.

We continue to monitor cases and hospitalizations and will remain vigilant to ensure safety for all who worship in and enter our building.


Legislative Action


Earlier this spring, the Salt and Light Team held a forum to provide information on the proposed use of federal ARPA funds (American Rescue Plan Act). A portion of these funds were identified to assist areas of the communities of North and South Omaha which were particularly hit hard by the pandemic. The good news is that this funding assistance passed in the Legislature.

A second bill of interest to many was LB773 which would have allowed Nebraskans to conceal and carry firearms with a permit, training, or background checks. LB773 would have reversed current Nebraska law requiring background checks, train-

ing regarding firearms, and a permit. LB 773 failed. Current laws regarding carrying a concealed weapon will remain in place.

Kudos to all who participated in the democratic process this year by contacting state senators and following the legislature's activities. Wednesday, April 20 marked the last day of the 2022 session.

FUMC Finance News

FUMC Finance Report

Carol Beaty, FUMC Finance Chair

Here is the FUMC monthly report to the congregation written on March 31, 2022.

Average monthly pledges needed to meet our budget of \$650,000 in pledge income = \$54,167

Jan 2022 pledges - \$125,340.33 (some members paid entire year) 19.28% of annual budgeted pledges received

Feb 2022 pledges - \$115,092.97 (some members paid entire year) 36.99% of annual budgeted pledges received

Mar 2022 pledges - \$142,394.67 (some members paid entire year) 53.67% of annual budgeted pledges received

As of Mar 31, 1022, our total income is 44.25% of what we budgeted. Our expenses are 22.63% of what we budgeted. We would expect income and expenses to be at 16.67% at this time of the year. Our income is higher because of prepaid pledges. Our expenses are lower primarily because of some vacant staff positions. A copy of the church budget approved by the Church Council in January is available upon request. Please notify Carol Beaty or the church office if you would like a copy.
