


vision a place where pollinators can stop in and enjoy beautiful plants and flowers. I have a vision.






"This Here Flesh" Tuesdays at 7pm

30% to 40% of the entire US food supply is wasted. 43% of that waste comes from our homes and goes to our landfills. (Source: https://www.rts.com/resources/guides/food-waste-america/ (Recycle Track Systems) Once in the landfill it degrades, causing carbon dioxide. Composting keeps some of that food out of landfills, thus, creating less carbon dioxide.

Grocery stores also dispose of food that is past the "sell by" date or is bruised, blemished, and won't sell. In Omaha some of that food is rescued from the landfill by Saving Grace Perishable Food Rescue.

FUMC Finance News

FUMC Finance Report

Carol Beaty, FUMC Finance Chair

Here is the FUMC monthly report to the congregation written on September 15, 2022.

Average monthly pledges needed to meet our budget of \$650,000 in pledge income - \$54,167

Jan 2022 pledges - \$125,340.33 (some members paid entire year) 19.28% of annual budgeted pledges received

Feb 2022 pledges - \$115,092.97 (some members paid entire year) 36.99% of annual budgeted pledges received

Mar 2022 pledges - \$137,889.67 (some members paid entire year) 58.20% of annual budgeted pledges received

April 2022 pledges - \$43,571 - 64.91% of annual budgeted pledges received

May 2022 pledges - \$36,337 – 70.50% of annual budgeted pledges received

June 2022 pledges - \$26,281–74.54% of annual budgeted pledges received

July 2022 pledges - \$36,012.67-80.08% of annual budgeted pledges received

August 2022 pledges - \$29,577.67-84.63% of annual budgeted pledges received

As you can see, we are in great shape receiving pledge income this year. This means the average pledges needed to meet our budget going forward is \$24,974 per month.

As of Aug 31, 2022, our total income is 80.31% of what we budgeted. This includes \$30,490 from Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC is a federal Covid program) which we will not need until next year. Our expenses are 60.00% of what we budgeted. We would expect income and expenses to be at 66.66% at this time of the year. Our income is higher because of prepaid pledges and the ERTC. Our expenses are lower primarily because of some vacant staff positions in the early months of this year.
