THINK ON THESE THINGS

Philippians 4:8

The turning of the calendar brings us to September. By the time you're reading this I hope the dog days of summer are coming to an end and there is a hint of fall in the air. Today is mid-August and the rain set in yesterday so I'm hopeful that change is coming. I know by intellect the seasons change as the earth continues its rotation around the sun but there are times when the summer temperatures go into triple digits that I forget, doubt, or wonder when that ro-

tation will finally take place that provides the next season.

And then, in a more serious note about the constant change we see around us - this morning I read of the passing of another great theologian of this age, Frederick Buechner. Often when I did not have the words for a given occasion I would turn to his and I have used his book, Beyond Words, for daily devotionals. In that book he wrote these words about eternity,

"Eternity is not endless time or the opposite of time. It is the essence of time.

If you spin a pinwheel fast enough, all its colors blend into a single color - which often appears white - which is the essence of all the colors of the spectrum combined. If you spin time fast enough, time-past, time-present, and time-to-come all blend into a single timelessness or eternity, which is the essence of all times combined.

As human beings we know time as a passing of unrepeatable events in the course of which everything passes away - including ourselves. As human beings, we also know occasions when we stand outside the passing of events and glimpse their meaning. Sometimes an event occurs in our lives (a birth, a death, a marriage - some event of unusual beauty, pain, joy) through which we catch a glimpse of what our lives are all about and maybe even what life itself is all about, and this glimpse of what 'it's all about' involves not just the present, but the past and future too.

Inhabitants of time that we are, we stand on such occasions with one foot in eternity."

I am grateful for his words today and his message that we need to be alive to our lives. To observe and participate in not just our own life, but with the world around us, even if the events are indescribable. It makes me so glad that we stand together in this moment, with one foot in eternity. On the journey with you through time,

Instead, right now I'm focusing most on my credentialing process, which means I'm sitting on a lot of Zoom calls with other pastors in the Great Plains and answering a lot of ordination questions like "What is your understanding of evil and how it exists in the world?" Just the easy parts of being a pastor. And while it can be easy for me to hyper focus on these tasks for ordination, mainly because I really want to finish this, so I don't have to write these papers again, my call is still to

serve in the local church and to minister better to all of you at First.

What that looks like is me attending finance, SPRC, nominations meetings and learning how to lead a wedding (Something I've never done before but now legally can). I will also be growing my pastoral care abilities, doing visits and meeting with people. For myself, this might also include doing a Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) class. While those for me are some of my growing edges, things I want to improve on for my ministry, this is also a time where I can utilize my true passions. My first year here, I was really doing what needed to get done and there was not a clear role or a defining of what I, Maddi, love about ministry and the work of God. So here are some of the things I'm truly passionate about, those things I love doing and which fuel my soul. First, I'm passionate about justice and being out in the community to take a stand for what is right. I also love teaching people about scripture, but not in a "you better believe in Jesus or else" but in ways which show just how liberative the Bible can be. I'm also passionate about small groups, especially for young adults and college students. Guiding people and mentoring them in the questions of their faith is something I love to do and be a part of. But more than anything, I love hearing what gets other people excited and fired up. I want to hear from you, I'd love for you to email or tell me on Sunday morning what you are passionate about, because in ministry connecting our passions to gether is something I care about. Retired Pastor Don Bredthauer will lead the workshop in Mead Chapel. (Enter through door 9 or 11.)




You already know FUMC has a Sustainability Master Plan that includes Energy, Transportation, Waste and Recycling, and Engagement.

You already know FUMC has beautiful, new waste cans in the Gathering Place and The Commons to separate paper and recyclables from landfill waste.



But, did you know as we continue our work on the Sustainability Master Plan that waste management is one area for our attention?



According to the Sustainability Master Plan, our goal is to divert 80% of our waste from the landfill by 2030. (2019 level estimated at 17%) By diverting materials from the landfill, we not only reduce greenhouse gas emissions, but increase the landfill's lifespan.

You are invited to be a part of the discussion with the ECO Team and leaders of FUMC on Wednesday, September 7th at 3 p.m. to discuss and explore next steps for waste management at FUMC. The meeting will conclude by 4 p.m.

FUMC Finance News

FUMC Finance Report

Here is the FUMC monthly report to the congregation written on August 15, 2022.

Average monthly pledges needed to meet our budget of \$650,000 in pledge income = \$54,167 Jan 2022 pledges - \$125,340.33 (some members paid entire year) 19.28% of annual budgeted pledges received Feb 2022 pledges - \$115,092.97 (some members paid entire year) 36.99% of annual budgeted pledges received Mar 2022 pledges - \$137,889.67 (some members paid entire year) 58.20% of annual budgeted pledges received April 2022 pledges - \$43,571 – 64.91% of annual budgeted pledges received May 2022 pledges - \$36,337 – 70.50% of annual budgeted pledges received June 2022 pledges - \$26,281 – 74.54% of annual budgeted pledges received July 2022 pledges - \$36,012.67 – 80.08% of annual budgeted pledges received

As you can see, we are in great shape receiving pledge income this year. This means the average pledges needed to meet our budget going forward is \$25,895 per month.

As of July 31, 2022, our total income is 75.07% of what we budgeted. This includes \$30,490 from Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC is a federal Covid program) which we will not need until next year. Our expenses are 52.38% of what we budgeted. We would expect income and expenses to be at 58.33% at this time of the year. Our income is higher because of prepaid pledges and the ERTC. Our expenses are lower primarily because of some vacant staff positions in the early months of this year.
