THINK ON THESE THINGS


Philippians 4:8

Salt & Light Team



UNITED METHODIST GENERAL CONFERENCE APRIL 23 - MAY 3, 2024

After several delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic, The United Methodist Church is prepared to convene its General Conference from April 23 to May 3, 2024, in Charlotte, North Carolina. This meeting of delegates - equal numbers of clergy and laity - from around the world is where legislation will be considered that may impact the polity and governance of the denomination.





The long-awaited regular session set for spring 2024 comes after an era of disaffiliation of congregations related to concerns over human sexuality policies and full inclusion of LGBTQIA+ individuals in the life of the church.



FUMC Finance Report

Here is the FUMC monthly report to the congregation written on Mar 15, 2024.

The Budget approved by the Church Council for 2024 included \$905,310 in income and \$930,919 in expenses. We include the reminder that if we have all the expenses that were budgeted, we will have to use church reserves to make up the difference. The budget for pledges is \$700,000, an increase of \$50,000 over 2023. Thanks to all who pledge, and who give, generously.

Average monthly pledges needed to meet our budget of \$700,000 in pledge income = \$58,333. Jan 2024 pledges - \$223,757 (some members paid entire year) 32.0% of annual budgeted pledges received.

Feb 2024 pledges - \$34,467 (some members paid entire year) 36.89% of annual budgeted pledges received.


As of Feb 29, 2024, our total income is 32.45% of what we budgeted. Our expenses are 16.01% of what we budgeted. We would expect income and expenses to be at 16.67% at this time of the year. Our income is higher because of prepaid pledges. Our expenses are close to expectations.
