# THINK ON THESE THINGS

Philippians 4:8

At a recent staff meeting we were talking about all that has already taken place in this calendar year. We celebrated friends who transitioned to new life. We made difficult decisions about closures due to the weather—and we may not be done with that. We took down the Christmas/

Advent décor and set the building for a new year. And I'm writing this on just the 17th day of the year. It brought to mind a phrase I've heard a lot lately, "the days are long but the years are short." It's a better consideration than simply saying 'time flies.'

I'm not sure if I completely buy into any of that because time is time and it doesn't change, but it can certainly feel that way. With that in mind I can hardly believe that I'm going to remind us the season of Lent begins on Wednesday, February 14, with our Ash Wednesday service. Yes, on Valentine's Day. If you've ever wondered, the Easter date is set by a formula. Easter occurs on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. According to the Gregorian (Western church) calendar, the earliest date that can occur is March 31 and this is the year! In this month of February we are going to quickly move into the 40 day period of Lent that leads to Easter.

All of which means, we are doing rapid planning. This year's Sunday morning worship services are focused on Passion. That's a word that perhaps brings to mind love and relationships, but people who are angry can be passionate. People who work for social justice are passionate. St. Patrick's Day falls in the midst of Lent and Patrick was passionate about his missionary work, sharing the word of God. 

Learn from the experts at an all church forum on Sunday, February 4th, 9:35 a.m. in the Commons.






#### **ECO TEAM**



Here is the FUMC monthly report to the congregation written on Jan 15, 2024.

Although we have not yet closed the books on 2023, we made great progress in December 2023. We had income of over \$81,000. Some of this was income for our 2023 budget. Some was for pre-paid pledges for 2024. Some was for special projects including the Alternative Mall, music program, youth, Immigration. memorials and our Christmas collection. We are grateful for every one of you who contributed to the church in all of 2023.

The Church Council approved the budget for 2024 at the meeting on January 9. We were able to give church staff an increase. Please note that once again, the budget approved includes more expenses than income. The finance team and church council felt comfortable doing this as we have a healthy reserve.

## **LENT 2024**

There are certain words that bring to mind images and ideas. For the season of Lent we focus on the word PASSION. On a church calendar the Sunday before Easter is designated as Palm/Passion Sunday. A movie entitled "The Passion of the Christ" stirred up people. The readings on Good Friday are referred to as the passion.

What is passion in faith? Is it only about the events of Holy Week? Passion can be defined as emotions distinguished from reason – but are passions always within reason? Passion can be defined as an intense driving, or overmastering feeling or conviction. The word intense can draw certain connotations. As we walk through the 40 day journey of Lent we

will explore passion – the passion of care, of social justice, of inclusion, as well as the passion that can drive conspiracy and anger.

We begin with the passion of repentance on Ash Wednesday, February 14, with services at noon (chapel) and 7:00 p.m. (sanctuary). A schedule of all services and themes will be published in the bulletin and online.

We pray you will join us passionately on this Lenten journey.
